SPANISH PRONOUNS

A pronoun replaces a specific noun (person, place, or thing). English personal pronouns include *I*, *you*, *he*, *she*, *we*, *you* (*plural*), *and they*. Object pronouns substitute for a person or thing.

Reflexive Pronouns

Reflexive pronouns "reflect" a noun or pronoun by taking the place of its antecedent when the noun or pronoun is doing something to itself. In English, reflexive pronouns are generally formed by adding **-self** or **-selves** to the root pronoun, as in: *We underestimated ourselves before the race*.

The cat washed herself carefully with her tongue.
