

# CChHerAST <br> one of the seven Principles of Art 

## Contrast occurs when two related elements are different.

## The greater the difference the greater the contrast.

CONTRAST draws the viewer's eye into your artwork, strengthens their focus on key features, and helps to guide them around your painting or drawing. You can create strong contrasts when you place a bright color next to a dull color, a thick line next to a thin line, filled spaces next to unfilled spaces, and more.

In this worksheet, explore a few types of contrast, practice spotting examples of eight types of contrast, and play word games to become familiar with common terms related to contrast as one of the principles of art.

## Let's begin by exploring 8 types of contrast

| COLOR | Complimentary colors are opposites on the color wheel <br> (such as red vs. green, blue vs. orange, yellow vs. violet) |
| :--- | :--- |
| HUE | Saturated, rich colors (such as dark blue) vs. Unsaturated, dull or muted colors <br> (such as light blue) |
| TEMPERATURE | Warmer colors (such as red) vs. cooler colors (such as blue) |
| VALUE | Lighter colors (such as yellow) vs. darker colors (such as blue) |
| TEXTURE | Rough vs. smooth surfaces |
| SHAPE | Organic vs. geometric shapes |
| SIZE | Large vs. small shapes |
| SPACE | Positive (filled) vs. negative (unfilled) spaces |
