

## 2022 Spring Cost Sheet for Exchange Students

International students engaged in approved exchange programs pay tuition to their home institution. All other charges - housing accommodations, dining, mandatory fees, health insurance, miscellaneous expenses including specific course materials and fees – are the responsibility of the student and must be paid either to Purchase College (see below) and a private landlord off-campus (if students choose that option). The costs are estimates and may be subject to increase.

International Students, by U.S. Law are required to submit proof of payment availability to Purchase College. All accepted exchange students must submit the <u>International Student Financial Statement</u> along with proof supporting <u>proof of funding</u>.

All financial documents are due no later than **November 15, 2021**. Purchase College will create an I-20, required for you to obtain a student F-1 visa. Dependent visas (F-2) are not issued for exchange student dependents. Further instructions on how to obtain a visa will be e-mailed to you once an I-20 has been created. You may also find an overview of the process on our <u>New F-1 Students</u> page.

These estimates do not include the cost of travel to and from or within the U.S., nor any expenses incurred when the College is not in session, for example, during Thanksgiving recess, spring break, semester break, etc. Please note, the college does not provide break housing & meals; students should prepare to make alternative plans.
